

Baylor University Collins Hall Renovations

WACO, TEXAS










Kirksey worked with JE Dunn on the renovation of the freshman women's residence hall, Collins Hall, on the Baylor campus. The goal was to create spaces that protect its rich community life and showcase its history while providing all the modern amenities students have come to expect. The result is a blend of traditional details and fun feminine accents that is "Uniquely Collins". Included in the design are two statement pieces: a 30-foot skylight and a double-sided fireplace.

Due to the success of the Collins Hall renovation design, Baylor awarded Kirksey additional renovation projects to modernize and bring two additional buildings up to code. For these projects Kirksey utilized Scan-to-BIM technology which streamlined the efficiency and accuracy of developing the as-built construction documents.

Brazosport College Main Campus Renovation and Addition

LAKE JACKSON, TEXAS
















As part of an extensive, multi-phased renovation of their original 1969 main campus building, Brazosport College hired Kirksey to design a new 21,000 sf infill addition to house their Student Life Center (SLC) and renovate their existing library to accommodate new technology and functional demands. Because all renovations and infill projects/additions occur simultaneously, the phasing schedule was very complex. The Student Life Center houses all the campus organization offices, such as intramural sports, Student Government, and various clubs. Additionally, there are seminar/study rooms, an internet café, and ample study nooks and gathering spaces throughout.


The 35,000 sf Library renovation incorporates two floors of the main building and 7,000 sf of infill for additional stacks. The renovated library also accommodates the relocated Learning Assistance Center which provides student services such as testing, computer labs, and study rooms as well as the relocated Transitional Education Center which provides teaching and study rooms, a writing lab, and offices for staff.


Lamar University Setzer Student Center Renovation

BEAUMONT, TEXAS













Kirksey was selected to renovate the Lamar University Setzer Student Center which was in need of upgrades to increase and revitalize all of the existing building space for vibrant and relevant student activities. The building represents the "crown jewel" on campus and serves as a recruiting tool for prospective students. The renovated facility incorporates a new entrance that faces the student quad as the central focal point, a new campus "living room," multiple meeting rooms for student use, and a double-height multi-purpose room as well as an expanded kitchen.

Before the renovation, no logical pedestrian flow had been established for the building. Kirksey's renovation created a clear path for student travel, establishing collaborative gathering spaces, study nooks, and points of interest such as coffee kiosks along the way. More natural light was brought in by opening up the space and incorporating more sustainable features by reusing parts of the existing structure, respecting long wearing finishes such as the terrazzo, brick and exposed concrete, and increasing the energy efficiency of the building.

Stephen F. Austin State University Micky Elliot College of Performing Arts Addition & Renovation

Kirksey, in conjunction with Steinberg Hart, completed programming and design services for Stephen F. Austin State University's new 30,000-sf fine arts performance venue addition along with renovations of related spaces within the existing 77,000 sf Micky Elliot College of Performing Arts. The addition included the development of multiple new performance venues, including a 300-seat and 125-seat flexible theater, and related spaces to accommodate past and future growth in SFA's fine arts academic programs.

Beyond the development of the new performance venues, additional spaces include design studios, movement studios, rehearsal spaces, costume design and creation areas, and multiple storage areas for scene and prop storage. The new design solved the challenge of a lack of a main entry as well as enlargement of the current lobby. The updated 3,000-sf two-story lobby accommodates a wide variety of campus functions and an art gallery space for the Visual Arts department to display student work and traveling exhibitions.

The exterior of the building includes dynamic new façade panels or "Dragon Scales" which represent movement, rhythm, and drama—directly relating to the programs within the Micky Elliott College of Fine Arts.

Movement: The façade changes as you move around it and with time of day.


Rhythm: The patterning of accent panels and glazing change in density.

Drama: The purple "wow" factor is accented by uplighting at night.


Texas A&M University Corps of Cadets Halls Renovation & New Living Learning Centers


COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS













Kirksey and SpawGlass were selected by Texas A&M
University to renovate nine existing buildings that house the
Corps of Cadets on the College Station campus. With 2,600
cadets living "on the Quad", the Corps dorms are a vital and
thriving part of campus life. Built in the 1930s, the Aggie
Corps of Cadets housing needed an aesthetic reboot and
modernization. Together, Kirksey and SpawGlass worked with
TAMU to revitalize and preserve the dorms and bring one
of the most central pieces of Aggie history back into visual
prominence.

The project team developed a process to renovate and modernize a historic set of housing facilities under an extremely tight schedule. Through the design/build process, Kirksey and SpawGlass established a plan that saw all nine buildings completed in 24 months, utilizing phased construction packages. Phase I included completion of the first five buildings while Phase II saw the remaining four completed. To modernize the outdated facilities, the project

team ensured the integration of complex mechanical systems which included a waterproofing envelope analysis, plan for structural modifications, and addition to existing buildings.

In addition to renovating nine, four-story buildings, two new Leadership Learning Centers were added for independent and collaborative student study, and to house the Corps Area Housing Office and additional support operations.


University of Houston Conrad N. Hilton College of Global Hospitality Leadership Renovation & Expansion





The University of Houston Hilton College renovation and expansion project includes a complex \$26-million, 64,000-sf expansion and 68,000-sf renovation of the existing Hilton Hotel to increase the key count from 80 to 150, and to include more classroom and meeting spaces.

The renovation includes a new five-story tower facing the student center across the street and revamps the hotel's current rooms, courtyard, lobby and public spaces.

University of Houston Melcher Life Science Renovation

This complex \$12-million, 54,000-sf renovation project included approximately 13,000 square feet of space that was available to be repurposed within an existing, now empty, competition swimming pool. The Melcher pool has been decommissioned for several years and the university had decided to fill it in, and build-out a mezzanine area within the two-story volume of space. In-depth and detailed programming was included within the scope of work and required the department of Communication Sciences & Disorders (CSD) to move out of their existing spaces in the Clinical Research Services Building & Annex and other space they occupied in another part of campus. This shuffling of programs allowed CSD to now occupy approximately 18,000-square feet located with the pool build-out area. Additionally, the college of Health & Human Performance (HHP), which was occupying space within the current construction area, was located to new swing space for a temporary home while new office, classrooms, and labs were constructed. At the completion of construction, HHP was able to occupy approximately 19,000-square feet of purpose-built space design to meet the needs of the college, especially the many unique labs and teaching spaces required as part of the curriculum.




